Bring each day of camp:

- Your well-rested Camper!
- Wearing comfy pants or shorts and their Camp T Shirt (they will receive on the first day of camp)
- Close-toed shoes (NO sandals due to safety concerns backstage and outside!)
- A sack lunch (If your camper has dietary restrictions, please also send a snack with them.)
- NOTHING ELSE. Please do not allow your campers to bring a backpack of toys or other items - They crowd our team tables, and your campers will be plenty busy!

Your camper will receive:

- Camp T Shirt
- "How To Train Your Dragon Jr" Script & Pencil
- Water Bottle & Sticker
- A daily snack (If your camper has dietary restrictions, please also send a snack with them, in case our snack options don't fit their needs.)
- Other crafts or projects completed during camp

Other things to bring, on special days (We'll let you know when!)

- A Shoebox labeled with your camper's name, for set design dioramas
- A Paint Shirt labeled with your camper's name, for messy project days
- A Makeup bag or ziploc labeled with your camper's name, for our makeup workshop and shows, containing: Skin-tone Foundation, Natural or Light-colored Blush, Brown Eyeliner, Natural-colored Lip Liner, and Mascara. The kids love our makeup days!

Park in the parking lots on Josephine St. or Olive St.

Enter through the main front lobby doors for both drop-off and pick-up.

Camp Times & Dates:

- Drop off is from 8:45-9:00 A.M. each day. Please be on time. Camp will begin immediately after.
- Pick up will be promptly at 3:00 P.M. each day. **NOTE:** If you are more than 10 minutes late, you'll be invoiced a \$10 fee. For 20 minutes, a \$20 fee. Our staff is all volunteers, and we want to respect their time. So please be punctual in picking up your camper or arrange for another family to check them out (Call or Text our Camp Admin to let us know if they aren't on your approved list.)

What we will learn and do throughout our camp days:

- ★ Auditions ("Auditions" happen the first day, although the kids don't really know they're doing it. Auditions consist of learning a short song cut and dance cut and playing theatre games so the directors can get to know your child's personality and skills. No need to prep anything!)
- ★ Choreography Rehearsals
- ★ Blocking Rehearsals
- ★ Music Rehearsals
- ★ Vocal Coaching
- ★ Team-Building
- ★ Workshops with local theatre professionals in a variety of areas. Some examples are: Projection, Improv, Makeup, Set Design, Prop Construction, Vocal Styles, Lighting, Stage Combat, etc.
- ★ Snack Break
- ★ Lunch Break
- ★ Playtime Outside (for littles), weather permitting
- ★ Crafts (making a prop or costume piece to use in the show)
- ★ Costume Fittings
- ★ Run-throughs of the show all the way through where they may receive "Notes" (things to change or work on for next time!) And later on, Dress Rehearsals!

About the Performances:

- At the end of camp, the kids will perform two “How To Train Your Dragon Jr” performances on the beautiful PAC Stage! The performances will run about 60 minutes long.
- Please feel free to invite family and friends! The show is free but there is a suggested donation of \$5. 100% of donations will be used to produce next year’s camp & offer scholarships.
- Exact showtimes are TBA but watch for Call Times to be announced via email.
- The show will be video recorded and available for free as a digital download a week or so after camp. We also have a professional photographer coming to take photos that will also be available to you! We are so glad to be able to provide these so you can unplug and enjoy your child's performance!

Sickness Policy:

- Anyone, Staff or Camper, who has been ill in the past 24 hours, is asked not to attend. Illnesses that disqualify you from attending are fever, cough, runny nose, chills, stomach bugs, diarrhea, pink eye, or any other contagious illness. A temperature of over 100 disqualifies them from attending for the day. If you have a doubt about their health, please consult our Camp Admin or keep them at home. Follow the “Golden Rule.”
- ALWAYS notify One Eleven Theatre by 9am if your child will be late or absent on a particular camp day, due to sickness or another emergency. Notify us via text to our Camp Admin.
- If we notice your Camper is ill with one of the contagious symptoms above or they are not feeling well and/or the camp nurse is concerned, a parent or guardian will be required to pick the camper up immediately. We will call the phone numbers on your registration form, so please keep your phones handy.
- If your child has severe dietary restrictions, please send a snack option along in their lunchbox, in case they are unable to eat the snack option on a given day.
- If your child has a severe allergy or a medication or epipen they need to keep with them, please list it on your registration form, and the counselors will be informed.

Cell Phone Policy:

- ❖ Cell phones will not be allowed for camper use, even during breaks, to help our campers focus and connect with each other, and also to prevent unwanted photos/videos being taken or shared. Please leave all phones and electronics at home. If you need to contact your camper, please call or text our Camp Admin. If your camper needs to bring a phone with them, they may not use it during camp hours (including breaks and lunch), and if it becomes a problem, it may be taken from them and kept safe by a counselor til the end of the camp day.

One Eleven Theatre's Code of Conduct:

We operate on a three-strikes policy. For the first offense, they will receive a warning from a counselor or director and their parents will be informed. For the second, parents will be called to pick up their camper immediately. At the third offense, the camper will be sent home immediately and not allowed to return.

Parents, PLEASE go over these rules with your campers to hopefully prevent any behavior issues:

- ❖ **BE KIND** - We have a strict policy against bullying, toward fellow campers and also toward our young counselors. This includes actions, words, and written words. Please encourage your campers to communicate with a counselor or director with concerns about themselves or another camper if they witness bullying.
- ❖ **STAY AGE APPROPRIATE** - We do not allow adult language or topics of discussion at our camps.
- ❖ **KEEP YOUR HANDS TO YOURSELF** - There will be no hitting or slapping or hurting each other of any kind, (unless safely done within a stage-combat workshop!) Also Campers' and Staff's space bubbles should be respected. If someone asks you to give them space, listen and respect them.
- ❖ **LISTEN AND FOCUS ON TEACHERS** - Listen and Focus when in Rehearsals & Workshops. Give directors and our special guests your full attention whenever possible, to show respect to our theatre professionals and also to allow you to learn everything they are hoping to teach you!
- ❖ **PARTICIPATE IN ACTIVITIES** - Sometimes older campers noticeably "sit out" which unfortunately inspires younger campers to copy them. All campers are encouraged to participate in every rehearsal and workshop. If a camper does not put forth any effort or sits out on purpose, their part (or even bit of choreography) may be reassigned, and they won't be as present in the final production as originally planned. Parents may also be notified by a camp counselor.

How Parents can Help:

- Please practice with your campers at home. Help them learn their lines, Review any choreography or other videos that are attached to emails, Play the music tracks provided and sing along with them if it's helpful!
- Please volunteer to help with Check-in, Check-out, Lunch Monitoring, or helping as a camp counselor or nurse. We also always need help with building, fitting costumes, doing makeup, and other creative areas! Reach out to us at oneeleventheatre@gmail.com with how you can help!
